Well, it's that time of year again - Re-Charter!

We are collecting re-charter fees for all Scouts and Scouters now and need them paid by *Oct 10* - this will ensure a timely submission of our 2018 charter application.

How much is the 2018 re-charter fee?

Boy Scouts of America has increased the registration costs this year to \$33 per each registered Scout or Scouter. Boy's Life subscriptions remain \$12. So, each Scout's recharter fee is \$45 and each Scouter's fee is \$33. Please make your check payable to *Troop 314*.

Scouter Note: In additional to remitting your annual fee, all Scouters must have a current Youth Protection Training certificate. This includes all registered Scouters 18 and older.

What are the dues for 2018?

This year's dues are **\$100**. This money is used for a variety of troop expenses, including Camporall and Camp-O-Ree, advancement, recruitment, equipment maintenance, *etc*. Dues may be paid in full or in installments. Please note, Scouts are encouraged to help "pay their way" by contributing at least 25% of their expenses. This money may be earned through fundraising comissions.

Eagle Scouts Note: According to T314 P&P, "Youth who obtain the rank of Eagle in Troop 314 are encouraged to remain with the Troop until their 18th birthday. It is understood that a youth obtaining the Eagle rank is qualified to lead the troop youth in many of the scouting activities throughout the scouting year. As an incentive to remain active with the Troop the Eagle Scout Fee structure is not to exceed 15% of the unit's yearly registration fee." (2018 Eagle Scout dues = \$15)

Here is some useful information about the importance of re-chartering from the 2017 OFFICIAL RECHARTERINSTRUCTION BOOKLET:

What is a Charter?

The chartering process is one of the oldest traditions in Scouting. It is the formal (legal) document that certifies the agreement between a Chartered Partner – an organization that agrees to utilize Scouting aspart of its service to youth and community outreach – and the Boy Scouts of America, setting expectations for the quality of program to be delivered to the Charter Partner's youth population. (T314's chartering organization is Post 555)

Why is a Charter Renewed Annually?

- Fosters a formal, timely plan for regular dialogue between charter organization and BSA.
- Assures up to date member registration in district/council Scout activities and rank advancement.
- Makes units eligible to qualify for yearly Journey to Excellence goal setting, review process andrecognition.

Unit Charters are issued for one year and expire on the last day of the charter renewal month (akarecharter date) printed on the charter. After that, units are "separated" from Scouting, the unit is "dropped" from BSA membership, as are all its members. [If] a unit is separated from Scouting, it ceases to exist and CANNOT legally operate in any capacity, including activities and advancement. An expired unit has no status in BSA and no insurance coverage for any of the unit's members and Chartered Organization. Youth and adults are unregistered, cannot attain awards and recognition. Advancement or achievement of any kind for the boys - including EagleRank – cannot take place, and tenure in rank and for leadership positions is stopped.

Troop 314 Meeting Notes

- First meeting of Month is time for Committee Chair Parents Meeting.
- The Second Tuesday is usual time for Scoutmaster Conferences.
- The Third Tuesday meeting includes Board of Reviews for Rank Advancement when not a COH.
- Fourth Tuesday could be for Patrol meetings if you are able to get the Scoutmaster to come early or close late.
- No meetings are usually held on 5th
 Tuesday. These are saved for Fundraisers, or special meetings at interesting locations.

Court of Honor is held 4 times a year, every 3 months – usually the last Scout meeting of month (except December). In **March** and **September COH** Scouts are honored for their rank advancements with a candle lighting ceremony and parents are given pins.

In **June** and **December**, **our COH** does not have candles and rank advancement pins for parents, but we add a potluck dinner in June – (Optional potluck in Dec.).



The Scout Shop will no longer require that a copy of the advancement report be turned in. A unit will now only need to present one copy of the Internet Advancement Report to purchase rank and Merit Badge Advancements for verification. Once the Scout Shop has reviewed the report, it will be returned back to the unit.

Eagle Scout Advancement reports will still need to be turned in to the registration department for processing, until such time as the online system can accommodate Eagle Scout advancements in the same way other advancements are accommodated.
